APPLICATION IS NOW AVAILABLE**

The Abby Snyder Memorial Scholarship Awards (\$1,500.00; \$1,000.00; \$750.00; and \$500.00 scholarships) are available to any Christian student applying for and entering into the first year of college. There is a list of criteria that the student must meet, including residence in the twenty-three county area to which NewVision FM broadcasts, letters of reference from the student's pastor, church council, and other requirements.

Students who wish to apply for the NewVision FM Scholarship must have their church or school request the latest 2020 revised copy of the guidelines and application form and enclose a S.A.S.E. Copies of the application will not be given to individual students. It is expected that churches or schools would make copies of the application for their own respective students. The application must be received at the NewVision FM studios on or before the 5:00 PM deadline on March 31, 2020, prior to the student's freshman year of college.

The decision on the scholarship recipients will be made by the end of April by two qualified educators who will judge the applications.
